

Getting access to MATLAB

MATLAB is a programming language designed for numerical computation, data analysis, and visualization developed by the MathWorks company in 1984. MATLAB is especially popular in engineering, science, and applied mathematics. Thanks to its huge community of users, MATLAB's documentation is remarkably rich and thorough. You can find the answer to almost any question you have about MATLAB by a simple Google search. There are two methods to get access to MATLAB.

Method 1: (obtain a license through BYUH)

If you haven't had a MathWorks account associated with your BYUH email, go to

<https://matlab.mathworks.com/>

Then click on "Sign In" and then click on "Create Account". Enter your BYUH email (either @go.byuh.edu or @byuh.edu), not your personal email. This email will be your MathWorks account. Then you will be prompted to create a password. To finalize the account creation, you might be asked to provide a verification code sent to your email address. You can use MATLAB Online using the link above, or you can install MATLAB on your local computer.

Method 2: (obtain a basic license)

Your MATLAB license through BYUH will no longer work after you graduate. However, a basic license allows everyone to use MATLAB Online for free for 20 hours/month. This limit is reset on the first day of each month. You can create a basic license from the beginning by going to:

Then click on "Sign In" and then click on "Create Account". Enter your personal email (not your BYUH email). Then you will be prompted to create a password. To finalize the account creation, you might be asked to provide a verification code sent to your email address.
